

GOLF TIP

Bad Lies ~ When you find yourself with a bad lie, the secret of recovery is often in the right choice of club, with relevant action. Here is an example of how to cope in one particular situation.

An iron shot from a divot hole ~ as with all recovery shots, you must move your weight more onto the left foot, hitting the ball with a downward attack. The ball may travel slightly lower than normal and is likely to finish right of the target. So be sure to aim left and take a more **left** club.

Because you cannot get under a golf ball, do not try to help it up. The worse the lie, the farther back in the stance you should play the ball. If necessary, set your feet left of the target.

THE PRO'S VIEW:



We continue to advise you on how to best manage your play at Monterey Pines Golf Course. You will only see the tougher Par 3 holes in this column as this month we work on:

HOLE #4: 192 YARDS, PAR 3
 This hole is tough! It's long and features two huge Monterey cypress trees that guard the left side of the green. The right side is trapped, leaving the golfer with only a small opening to hit to the green. Another problem can also occur. Most golfers either slice or face a golf ball, which is affected then by the prevailing afternoon breeze off the ocean.

There are two shots to play:

"The first shot option (geared to the more accomplished golfer) is to hit a high hard drive at the right side of the bunker (sand trap) bringing it right to left to the green".

"With the second shot option, the average golfer, using a club that will keep the ball low, can hit the ball and let it roll to the green. If it does not hit the green, at least there is the opportunity to chip it close and save par."



GOLF RULE

Rule 24-2b/8 ~ Question: A player whose ball lies in the rough close to the fairway is entitled to relief from an immovable obstruction. In obtaining relief under rule 242b(1), may the player drop the ball in the fairway?

Answer: Yes. There is no distinction in the rules between fairway and rough; both are covered by the term "through the green."

GOLF JOKE

"The PGA has implemented a new rule to reflect the modern times. Upon hitting a wayward shot, the golfer may cry "Gœ!" and thus be allowed to replay the ball from the previous spot. This may continue until the desired result is received."
